# **Be Adventurous**

In today's gospel reading, **Peter** goes one better than most in terms of being adventurous. He steps out of the boat and begins to walk towards Jesus across the water. Walking on water is not something any of us would attempt. Yet, at a more symbolic level, Peter's walking on water can be an image of our lives from time to time. There are times when we feel that the ground on which we stand is not all that solid. We sometimes say, for example, '**I'm not sure where I stand'** or '**I'm not sure of my ground'** when we are perplexed or unsure of something. Most of the time, we try to avoid these kinds of experiences that leave us feeling vulnerable. We often feel the urge to seek out solid ground and stay there at all costs.

Today's gospel reading invites us to reflect on the ways that the Lord may be calling us to take some new steps in our relationship with him. It may be an invitation to grow in our understanding of our faith through reading or reflection, or to use our gifts in a new way in the parish community or to take our family responsibilities more seriously. It might take the form of a call to become more prayerful, or a call to take some step to become reconciled with someone from whom we have been estranged for a long time.
