Who is My Neighbour?

'Who is my neighbour? The lawyer asks Jesus. At first sight Jesus instead seems to tell him what it means to be a neighbor- to reach out and help. But in a subtle way he tells him who the neighbor is by making him not a fellow Jew but a foreigner, an outsider, a member of a despised ethnic group. In the battered bleeding man on the side of the road, the Samaritan sees not a Jew but a fellow human being who desperately needs his help. And he does what we all like to think we would have done in similar circumstances.

This story must have bothered those who heard it; it was threatening to them. What about us? The name Samaritan has no negative connotations for us. But think of other names of other races, other nationalities, other religions, other ethnic groups. Do any of them arouse negative feelings in you? If you feel no hostility at all to any of them, you are most unusual. It means you have grasped one of the central features of Jesus' message: that in the sight of God, differences of race, nationality, sex have no importance compared to our common humanity.

Christianity is a universal religion. It teaches that all men and women are sons and daughters of God, members of one great big family, all equally deserving of our respect and concern

There is no place for prejudice, disrespect or discrimination.
