## **Good Guides**

Most of us can probably think of people who, in the course of our lives, pointed us in the right direction. These were people who could see a little bit more clearly than we could at the time. We all need good guides from time to time; we need people who in the words of **St Paul's** letter to the **Philippians**, can direct us towards , 'whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, wharever is commendable' It is true we can react negatively to people who come across as knowing what is best for us and take it upon themselves to tell us what to do.

However, the art of pointing others in the right direction is more subtle than that. John the Baptist did not say to his disciples, 'Become disciples of Jesus'; he simply said, 'Look there is the Lamb of God.' Those who point us in the right direction are sharing something of their own experience and ensight. Their sharing serves as an invitation rather than a command. Such sharing will not always be responded to. Not everyone that John pointed in the direction of Jesus went on to become a disciple of Jesus. The art of pointing others in the right direction needs to be joined to a profound respect for human freedom.

Today, we thank **God** for the **John the Baptist** figures we have encountered in the course of our lives. We thank **God** for all those who were concerned enough about us to share something of their vision with us and who remained loyal to us even when we failed to take the path they pointed out to us.
