Greatness- what is it?

The boxer **Muhammad Ali**, or **Cassius Clay** as he was known before, had a habit of saying 'I am the greatest'. No one took exception to this statement because it was generally acknowledged that among heavy weight boxers he was indeed the greatest. But he wasn't taking himself too seriously.

The question 'Who is the greatest?' is never far from us. An even more significant question is 'in what does greatness consist'?

It is only when we have answered the question, 'In what does greatness consist?' that the question, 'Who is the greatest?' can be answered. Jesus defines greatness by his self-emptying love of others. As he declared at the end of today's gospel reading, he came not to be served but to give his life as a ransom for others. St Paul captures this truth about Jesus when he says of him that 'he emptied himself, taking the form of a servant'. The truly great people among us are those who serve others in a selfless way, without looking for anything in return.

We can all identify such people in our own minds. If we encountered such people during our lives, we will have been greatly blessed by them. There will have been occasions in our own lives when we will have risen to this form of greatness. These are the times when we give ourselves to others at some cost to ourselves, without there being any obvious benefit to ourselves. Today's gospel reading suggests that such selfless service of others didn't come easy to the disciples and it doesn't always come easy to us either. *Fr Martin Hogan*
