Feast Days

Sept. 21st St Matthew (Apostle)

Matthew was a tax collector when called by Jesus. As well as an apostle he is also one of the four evangelists. He is said to have been a missionary in Persia and Ethiopia. He is the patron saint of accountants and tax collectors.

Sept. 23rd St Pius of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio)

Padre Pio was a Capuchin friar, stigmatist, confessor and friend of all who suffer. He died on this date in 1968.

Sept. 23rd Ss Cosmos and Damien (physicians)

They were martyrs of the early church in **Syria**. They were known as the **Anargyri** because they never took money for their medical services.

God is Just and Generous

Jesus does not see things as we do. Time & time again in his parables, he turns our expectations upside down and helps us to see things in a different light.

Today, he tells the story of the land owner who pays all his workers the same wage – those who came at the crack of dawn and those who came at the eleventh hour. Naturally, the 'early birds' are put out by this- they feel it is unjust, even though they receive the wage they were promised. Maybe we sympathise with the complainers. In our individualistic society, we can fall into the trap of thinking that only certain people deserve good things. Those who work hard, who are law abiding, who make the most of opportunities- they deserve a decent standard of living. Think of how often we hear people complaining about those who are struggling, saying they do not deserve assistance or 'handouts'? **Such criticism fails to take into account that not everyone has the same opportunities or privileges in life.**

But in this parable of **Jesus**, the landowner treats everyone the same, regardless of their productivity. **He recognizes that not all of them had the same opportunity-some were just luckier than others, in the right place at the right time**.

God is just and generous, and he expects us to have the same respect for everyone, regardless of their position in life.
