Eventually he ended up in prison. Surely now she would leave him to his fate? Not at all. She visited him without fail every week, carrying cigarettes and other things to him in a little carrier bag. One day one of the priests of the parish met her on her way to the prison. 'This son has ruined your life' the priest said 'He'll never change. Why don't you just forget about him?'

'How can I' she replied. 'I don't like what he's done but he's still my son'

You could say that woman was foolish. Yet she was only doing what any mother worthy of the name was doing, that is, loving her child through thick and thin. A mother never gives up. For most of us, the love of a mother is the most reliable kind of human love we all experience. It's no wonder that the Bible uses a mother's love as an image of God's love for us. Even when we are in sin God does not cease to love us. That's what today's gospel is telling us.
