Ascension Day

The real meaning of today's feast, the Feast of the Ascension is well expressed in the promise of the risen Lord to his disciples: "Know that I am with you always, yes to the end of time". The Lord promises to be with his church until the end of time. Earlier in the gospel Jesus had spoken the parable of the wheat and the weeds, suggesting that the church was a mixture of the good and the not so good. Jesus understood that the church would always have this mixture. Something of this is evident in the response of the disciples to the risen Lord in today's gospel reading: "They fell down before him, though some hesitated."

That group of disciples who were to be the core group of the new church were characterized by a readiness to surrender - and great hesitation before him. The people who make up the church are far from perfect; they are sinners striving to do the will of the Lord. It is this flawed group that the Lord promises to be with until the end of time.

We the church need to hear that reassuring promise again and againespecially in those times when as church we are aware that we are not yet all that the Lord is calling us to be.
