### Sour Grapes

The people who write novels and songs and make films and television series often tell stories of unrequited love. It's a theme that touches the hearts and minds of people rich and poor, humble and famous. It sometimes gives birth to great art and tragic figures like Shakespeare's Othello, "who loved not wisely, but too well."

**The bible**, which tells of God's dealings with the human race, is that kind of story. Over and over again we see God reaching out to his people, enveloping them in his love, and then being disappointed by their failure to respond.

**Today's readings** touch on the high and low of this love affair. Speaking through the prophet Isaiah, God asks, "**What more could I do** for you?"

**The psalm** recalls how God delivered the Israelites from bondage in Egypt, and wonders how they could have drifted so far from the Lord. **Jesus** tells the story again to a hostile audience and points out his own role in the tragedy. He reminds the religious leaders of their people's history: how God sent prophets to call them back and those prophets were rejected and even killed. He even sent his son and they killed him.

What about us? As a church we have sometimes yielded a rich harvest, but we have also fallen far short of what we should be.

As a people, we must each try to live in such a way that God's love affair with us may have a happy ending. James DiGiacomo, SJ
