The Choice Is Ours

You may have heard this story before: 'An old Cherokees is teaching his grandson about life. "A battle is going on inside all of us, "he said to the boy "It is a terrible fight and it is between two wolves. One is **evil** – anger, envy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, self- pity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority and ego. The other is **good**-joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion, and faith. This same fight is going on inside **you** – and every other person, too." The grandson through about it for a minute and then asked his grandfather, "Which wolf will win?" The old Cherokee simply replied, "The one you feed."

In a way, it is as simple as that. Each one of us faces hundreds of choices evert day. Mostly, they are minor decisions that may not seem important at the time. But they all add up to something.
